This document contains important information on how you can tender for this opportunity. Please read it fully and use it when preparing your tender.

About us

Forestry England is the largest land manager in England and custodian of the nation's public forests. Our mission is to connect everyone with the nation's forests by creating and caring for forests for people to enjoy, wildlife to flourish and businesses to grow.

We support the Forestry England, the non-ministerial department responsible for protecting, expanding and promoting the sustainable management of forests and woodlands in England, and work with Forest Research.

What we need

We will be awarding a permission for catering concession rights for the Longdale Lane car park at Blidworth Wood.

Our intention is to award this permission for a period of 1 year.

There will be an option to extend the permission by up to a further 4 years (5 years in total) subject to both parties being in agreement.

The decision on whether to use the extension option available will be at our discretion and we will base it on the performance of the first year on the permission.

The following information is intended to help applicants but the Forestry England will not accept any responsibility for opinions given nor for any errors, mis-descriptions or change of circumstances that may occur. Applicants will be expected to make their own assessments of the concession potential of the area and submit bids accordingly. In doing so they should bear in mind the effects of any forestry operations, severe weather, events and other permissions.

Longdale Lane car park at Blidworth Wood serves one of the busiest woodlands open to the public in Nottinghamshire with annual visitor numbers estimated as 300,000 a year. The woodland is popular with walkers, horse riding, cyclists and recreational events such as endurance horse rides. The use of Blidworth Wood is a combination of local residents from the Mansfield, Kirkby and Ravenshead area, as well as business representatives. Past traffic counters show that daily use is very consistent throughout the week with a slight peak in the afternoons and more visitors at the weekends. Seasonal variations are small. and largely weather related, although harvesting operations in the woodland and the associated timber haulage can affect the public use and may require closure of the car

park for operational reasons. There will be operations planned for 2024 targeted for the Spring/Summer period.

There has been a catering concession on this site for over twenty five years serving the well-established customer base over a minimum of 5 days in the week.

The concession at Blidworth Wood will allow one catering unit to operate from the Forestry England's Longdale Lane car park. The location is marked on the attached map.

The unit must be of a high standard with regards to presentation and must meet all current health and hygiene legislation. An applicant's unit should be available for inspection prior to the issue of any permission and a recent photograph of the unit to be used on site should be included with this submission. Forestry England will carry out regular audits to ensure hygiene criteria are met during the permission period and the operator must be registered with the relevant environmental health department.

The successful applicant will be required to produce proof of Public Liability Insurance of £10 million minimum cover. The successful candidate will also be held responsible for maintaining the car park free of any litter arising from sales.

The tenant will be responsible for any rates and taxes that may be levied on the concession by the appropriate authorities.

The Forestry England reserves the right to close the site during periods of severe weather and to carry out all forestry operations or ancillary work e.g. fencing, tree works, road construction/repairs etc. and the concession holder must accept all risks involved. No claim will be entertained for reduction in visitor numbers or sales or any other reason resulting from the Forestry England's programme of operations in the area or for any other reasons beyond their control.

The Forestry England reserves the right to request the Concessionaire to move to any reasonable location within the carpark zone and to comply with any future restrictions caused by Covid 19.

The Forestry England is keen to encourage high quality and healthy food options as well as locally sourced produce and a sample menu must be included with your bid. We would also encourage the use of reusable or biodegradable food and drink containers. We will work with the successful bidder to promote their concession of the Forestry England website, with photographs and a copy of the menu.

The concession is often the first point of contact for visitors to the woods so we would welcome tenders from people who are willing to work with us to effectively promote the woodland and help us deal quickly and effectively with issues.

The permission will operate for the period of one year but may be extended for a further period (up to a maximum of 4 years) subject to the agreement of the Forestry England.

Note: Tenderers must include details of any areas where they will not be able to comply with these requirements. If your Tender does not meet these requirements we reserve the right to reject it completely.
