Walk in medieval footsteps!

Just as the monks walked these woods, there are two circular trails for you to enjoy. The longer of the two, the Abbot's Amble, leads to the lake which was originally dug in the 13th century by monks from Michelham Priory. At this time the wood would have been mainly oak, and even now the shorter Oak Walk takes you through oak woodland with a bed of bluebells to enjoy in the spring.
