All events will start from the Bedgebury Visitor Centre unless otherwise specified.

# Aquatic wildlife walk - Saturday 25th May 10am - 12pm Dean Morrison, South East Rivers Trust

Discover the plants and wildlife that call the lakes, streams and waterfall at Bedgebury home, with the South East Rivers Trust.

Enjoy the beauty of the Pinetum and its very special birdlife at a time of day when the site is normally closed to visitors. You'll be on an exciting 6am adventure to find and identify as many of Bedgebury's migrant visitors and resident birds as possible during this two-hour walk.

Please bring binoculars if you have some. Please note that this walk begins before Bedgebury is open and will not be suitable for children - there is a family bird walk later in the morning at 9am.

Find out more about the ecology of the creatures you discover in the specially set live traps before releasing them back into the wild.

Do you want to be able to tell your gatekeeper from your meadow brown?

Join butterfly enthusiast Anna Picken on a butterfly and day-moth walk. Find out about the resident and migrant butterflies that can be found in the Pinetum. Anna will share stories of the habits of butterflies and day-moths helping you to identify the species you spot during this 2-hour walk.

# Anna will follow a pre-planned route of roughly 2 miles, taking in as much diverse habitat as possible whilst recording the number and species of butterflies and moths seen along the way.

Bedgebury is a great place for bats, and six species of bat have been recorded here, including the spectacular noctule bat and secretive brown long-eared bat.

Walk at sunset with bat enthusiast and Pinetum Supervisor Julian Dormady to learn more about these mysterious creatures as you experience the sights and sounds of the Pinetum at night.

# Tree-mendous nursery tour - Sunday 2nd June 11am - 1pm Liz Randall and Emma Bacon, Forestry England

Tree conservation is at the heart of Bedgebury Pinetum and seed collecting is just the beginning.

Find out what happens to threatened and endangered seeds once they are brought back from exotic locations around the world during the Bedgebury tree team's collection trips. This walk and talk with Forestry England staff is a unique opportunity to learn more about Bedgebury's conservation work and to visit the Pinetum nursery. The nursery is where some of the world's rarest trees have been propagated and nurtured over the years and is usually closed to public access.
