

Two areas of wet woodland will be designated as Natural Reserves. No further management operations will be carried out in these areas (unless on H&S grounds) and the woodland ecosystem will be allowed to evolve naturally.

The 2 PAWs areas will be managed through continuous cover systems and reverted back to broadleaves. A shelterwood system selection will be used under the mature Scots pine in Newlands Wood to create adequate light for natural regeneration allow some enrichment planting to become established. Group selection will be used else where to convert conifer stands back to broadleaves.

The proposed use of clearfell will be kept under review and a greater use of alternative systems will be introduced where appropriate to help establish the more diverse mixture of alternative species.

CCF systems will be applied where local circumstances suggest that this is the best approach. Silvicultural, aesthetic and environmental factors will be considered in determining the most appropriate system.

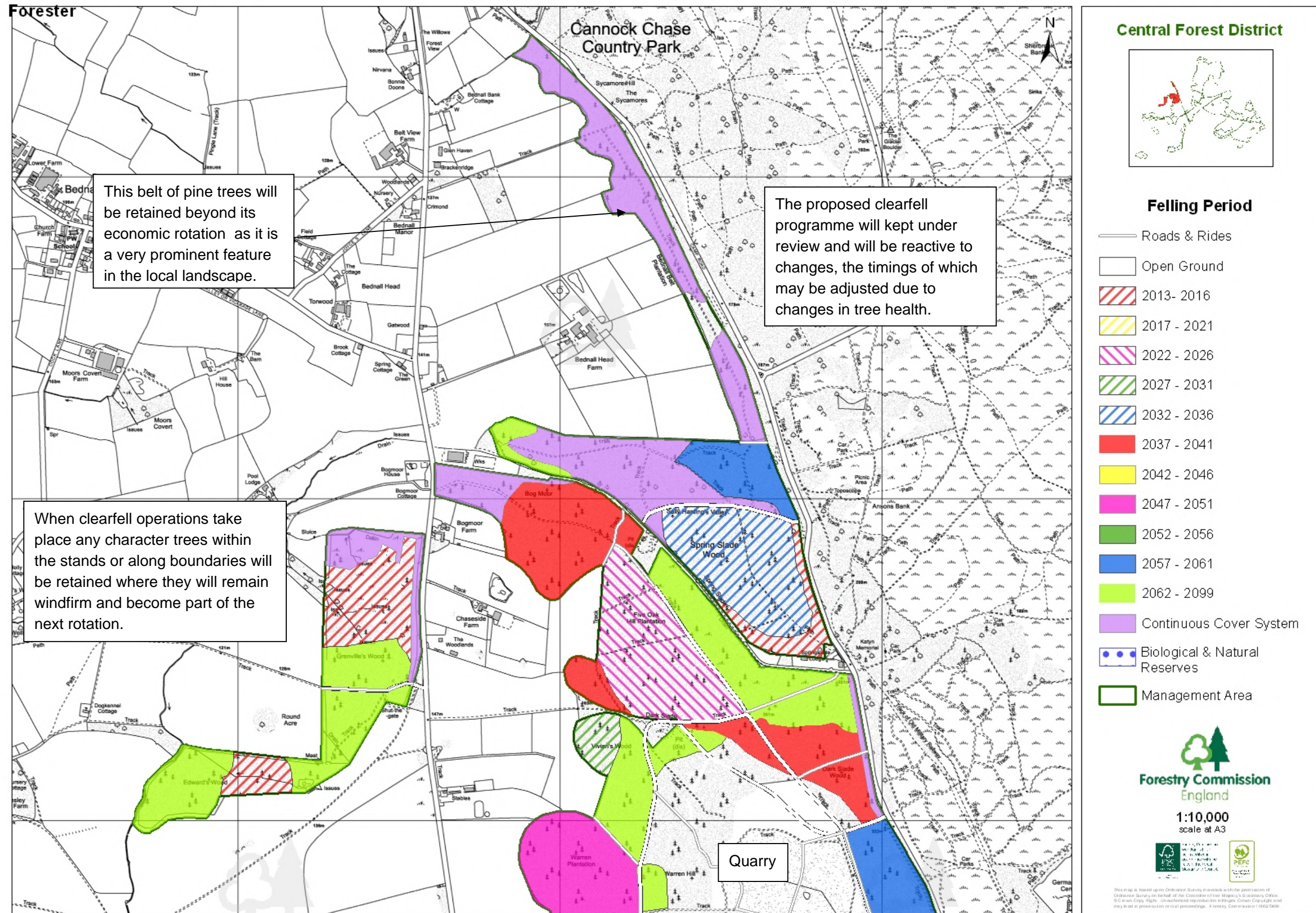

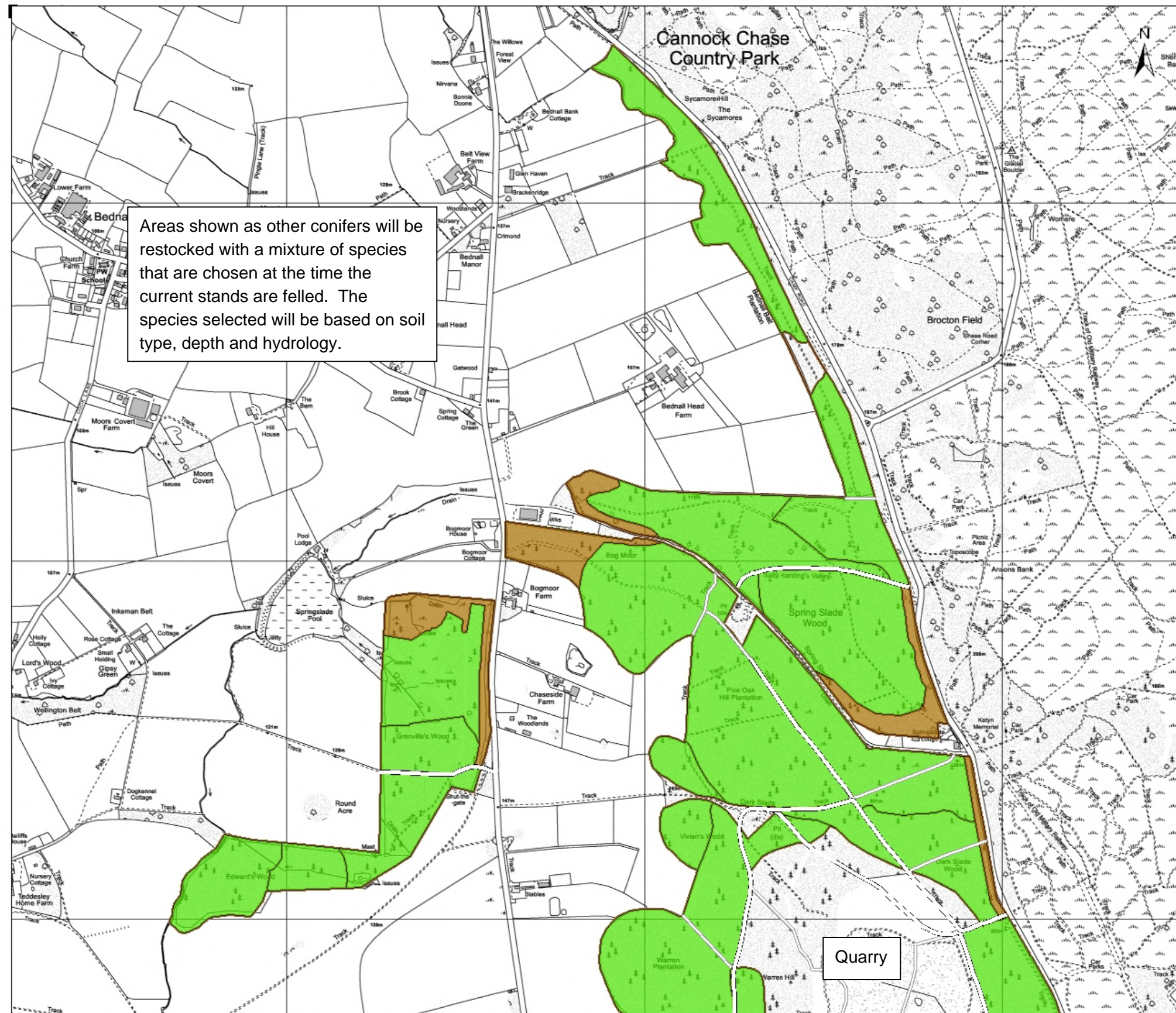

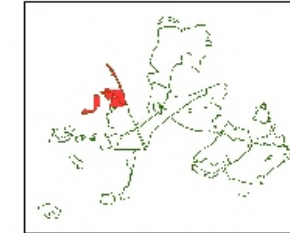
