



The veteran beech stands known as Anson Clumps will be retained in perpetuity and the surrounding pine stands will be managed as continuous cover with trees being selectively felled to allow the stands to remain. This will protect the beech from exposure to the elements and stabilize the microclimate around them.

When the riparian zone is felled small groups and individual broadleaves and conifers with well developed crown / shape and form will be retained to provide cover for wildlife and for landscape reasons.

This quarry will be managed under a Section 106 planning agreement.

Group felling will be used to open up the former wood pasture to remove conifers and open up the veterans.

The proposed clearfell programme will be kept under review and will be reactive to changes, the timings of which may be adjusted due to changes in tree heath.

When clearfell operations take place any character trees within the stands or along boundaries will be retained where they will remain windfirm and become part of the next rotation.
