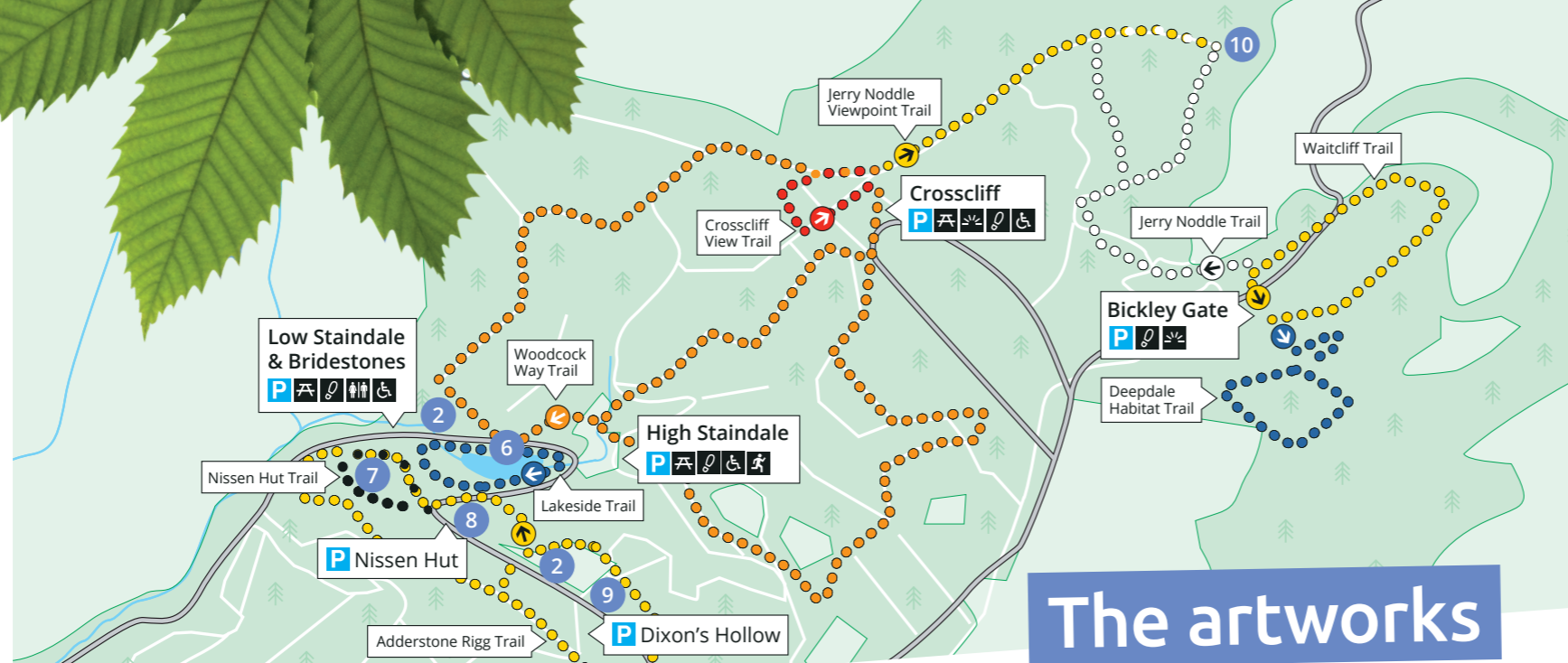
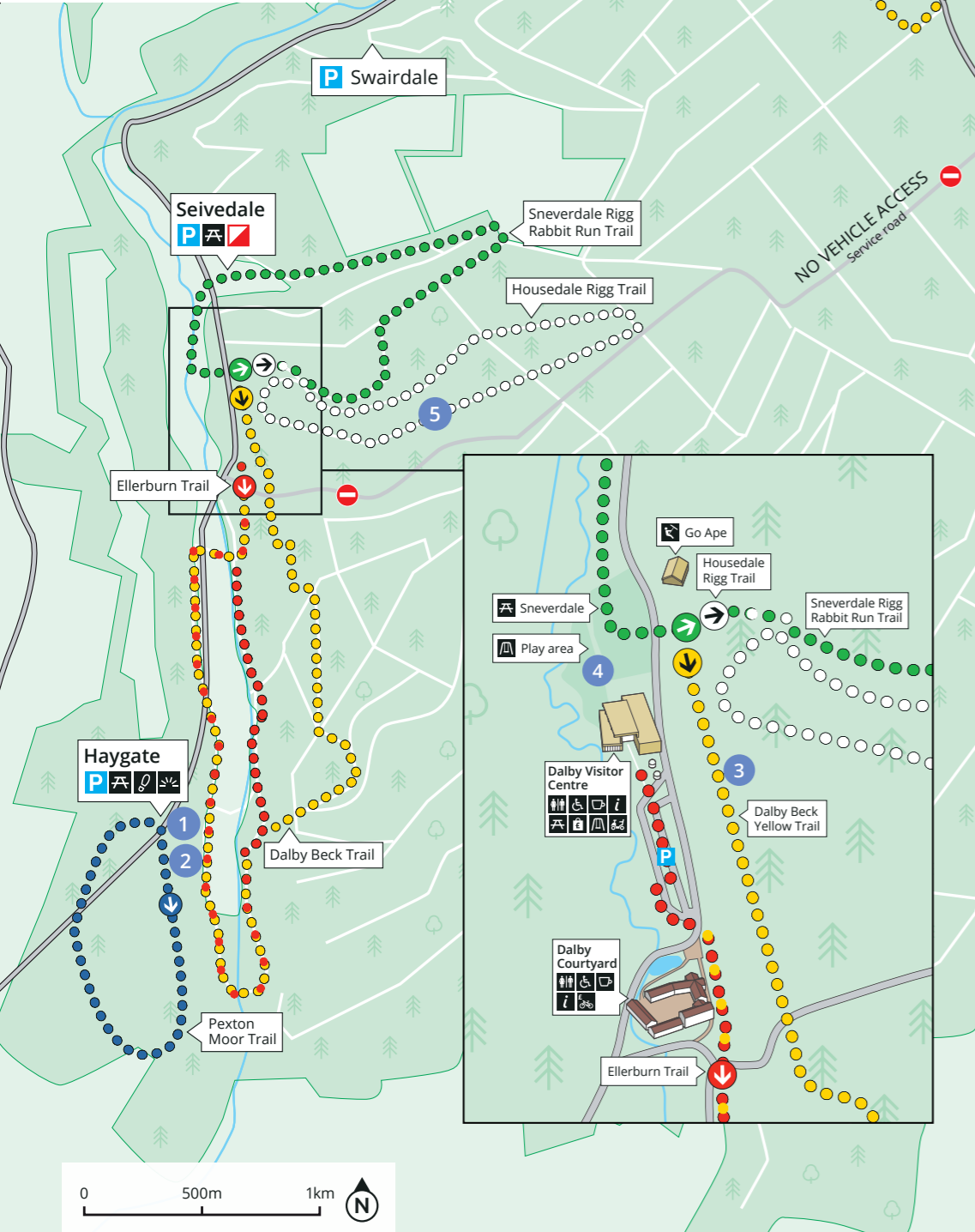

Commemorating the role of women in Britain's timber industry during World War II. The steel design captures the nature of their work.

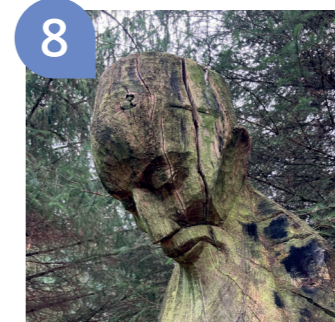

7 Nissen Hut, 2018

A concrete cast of a military structure invented by Major Peter Nissen during World War I. Used as workshops, office space, storage and work camps.



8 William de Dalby, 2004

A 9 foot wooden sculpture, inspired by the 14th Century tale of "William of Dalby", who was permitted to remain in the forest with cattle as a hermit.



9 Custodians, 2021

An evolving installation, inspired by the history that Forestry England is charged with preserving, and the future they plan to protect beyond their lifetimes.



10 Winged Sheep, 2020

An aedicula (shrine) cut into a huge sandstone rock. A small procession of sheep, also carved into the rockface, bow and kneel in homage to the Winged Sheep above them.
