About Us

Forestry England is a part of the government Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) and is tasked with the sustainable management of the Public Forest Estate for timber, recreation and wildlife.

Bedgebury National Pinetum is home to a world-leading collection of conifers. It is unique in the UK and of global significance for the purposes of species conservation, scientific advancement and the understanding of conifers. It is also a rich and biodiverse site providing habitat to a wealth of flora and fauna.

Role Description

Our Sunday Group volunteers meet once a month - usually the first Sunday to help us with the upkeep and maintenance of various sections of the pinetum. You will be guided by the pinetum tree team and led by the volunteer coordinator. This volunteer role provides an opportunity to learn new skills; to work to an agreed standard by following a programme of tasks and to work with members of the tree team and according to the pinetum landscape plan.

When?

 Usually the first Sunday of each month 10.00 - 13.00 (dates to be confirmed in advance)

Typical tasks include:

- Clearing scrub and weeds from around specimen trees
- Digging out saplings and regen
- Maintenance of tree cages
- Applying mulch
- Helping to maintain waterways

Volunteers will not be required to use power tools.

We'd like you to

- Enjoy working outside and take pride in your tasks
- Enjoy working as part of a team
- Be willing to follow guidelines set including health and safety and Covid
- Attend relevant training courses and be willing to learn from Forestry England staff
- Wear suitable protective clothing for working outdoors

We will provide

- A volunteer registration prior to taking up the role
- A volunteer induction, training and support
- Necessary tools, equipment, guidance, appropriate supervision for the tasks
- Appropriate personal protective equipment, including safety boots, gloves, safety glasses, hand sanitiser, medical gloves etc.
- A volunteer t-shirt/name badge/water bottle
- Free vehicle admission on your volunteer day
- A free cup of tea or coffee from the café on your volunteer day
- A volunteer's membership for free admission to Bedgebury Pinetum throughout the year after 35 hours of regular volunteering (reviewed annually)
- A volunteers' newsletter
- An invitation to annual events such as the 'Thank you' BBQ and other volunteer events
