# Wyre Forest

Wyre Forest and its surrounding woodlands are fantastic places to explore and enjoy the fresh air. So what are you waiting for?

## Trail information

Which trail will you choose?

### Easy Access Trail •••

1.1 km (0.7 miles)

Home to our family activity trail which changes annually. Follow the stone surfaced path, through mixed woodland, past our forest pond and sculptures. There are plenty of benches to relax along the way. It's relatively flat and suitable for mobility scooters and pushchairs, however there is a steeper uphill section near the end.

### Giants Trail •••

3.1 km (1.9 miles)

Head out on a wide forest road, then a stone surfaced trail which becomes narrower and flatter. The trail takes you past the arboretum, before slowly descending into the 'Valley of the Giants' where our large Douglas Fir stand tall. Whilst you can take a pushchair around the trail, please note some sections are steep and it's not suitable for wheelchairs.

### Arboretum Trail •••

5.5 km (3.2 miles)

Our longest trail takes you down Cardiac hill, under the Go Ape Zip Lines into a quieter area of the forest. Explore mixed woodland, forest pools and our arboretum where you can discover a variety of tree species and learn about the Whitty Pear. Sections of the trail are steep, unsurfaced or have exposed roots which can become muddy, making it unsuitable for pushchairs and wheelchairs.
