York Community WOOULdIIU

Welcome to York Community Woodland, a green space bringing people and nature closer together.

Developed in partnership with City of York Council and White Rose Forest, this woodland offers a sanctuary outside the city for exploration and tranquillity.

This woodland is part of Forestry England's commitment to expand the nation's forests. Once established, this will help nature recover across the wider landscape, providing habitat for valuable wildlife and helping to store carbon, alleviate soil erosion and help prevent flooding.

Getting around

Many paths in the woodland are on wider stone surfaces. These are generally flat, but may have some rougher sections. Some grass paths provide quieter routes around the woodland, but may be overgrown or muddy in places.

A permissive horse route connects Knapton underpass and Rufforth bridleway. This route is generally flat with some rougher sections, and is shared by visitors including those on horses.


